Looking to delay your IRA distribution? Now there's an option!

On July 21, 2014, the IRS approved Qualified Longevity Annuity Contracts ("QLACs") as eligible investments that can be purchased with IRA and qualified retirement assets. Under the new QLAC rules, as long as the longevity annuity meets certain conditions it becomes a "qualifying" longevity annuity and is determined to meet the required minimum distribution ("RMD") rules even though the individual has reached age 70½ and is not taking any income payment from their annuity until much later in life.

This is a significant new opportunity for individuals looking to delay taking RMDs from their IRA for up to 15 years, to as late as age 85. By delaying distributions, retirees can gain a significant tax advantage by not having to pay tax on money they don't currently need. The new regulations allow premiums paid into a QLAC to be excluded from RMD calculations.

QLACs need to meet certain eligibility criteria to be exempt from RMDs. Here's a summary of important features and restrictions:

- 1. You can only invest up to 25% of your combined IRA (excludes Roth and Inherited IRAs) and 401k account balances or \$125,000, whichever is less.
- 2. You can defer payouts only up to age 85.
- 3. QLACs cannot be invested in variable or index annuities.
- 4. Income options can be single or joint life, either life income or life income with cash refund.
- 5. Only limited optional features are allowed including riders for inflation adjustment, survivor benefits and "return of premium" death benefit.
- 6. No annual fees.



Be sure to stay for lunch following the morning's events. We'll see you there!





We rode bikes or walked to a friend's home and knocked on the door, or rung the bell or just walked in and talked to them. Imagine such a thing. Without asking a parent! By ourselves! Out there in the cold cruel world! Without a guardian.

How did we do it? We made up games with sticks and tennis balls and ate worms and although we were told it would happen, we did not put out very many eyes, nor did the worms live inside us forever.

Our actions were our own. Consequences were expected. The idea of a parent bailing us out if we broke a law was unheard of. They actually sided with the law, imagine that!

This generation has produced some of the best risk-takers and problem solvers and inventors, ever.

The past 50 years has been an explosion of innovation and new ideas. We had freedom, failure, success and responsibility, and we learned how to deal with it all. And you're one of those special people. Congratulations!
