Mark, from The History Center, provided astonishing accounts of how the city came together and overcame many obstacles in order to bring new life to the city. This city is a true gem.

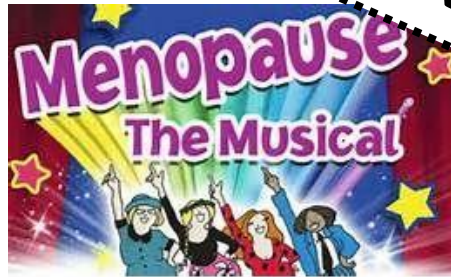
Our tour ended at the historical Sykora Bakery, located in the heart of Czech Village.

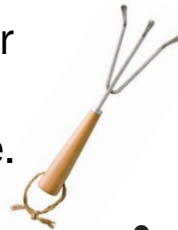
# Fall Gardening



## Tips



- There are some benefits to a non immaculate clean-up in the garden. Leaving some fallen leaves and twigs around and especially over the planting beds can be beneficial. This type of cover prevents soil erosion and moderates soil temperature.



- If you are looking for some plants with fall interest try certain trees and shrubs. For brilliant reds, red-oranges and purples choose: maples, sweetgums and dogwoods. For clear yellows choose: birches, ginkgoes, and clethra. You might also want to choose plants with a persistent berry display including: winterberry hollies, bayberries, and many species of viburnum. Other great choices for fall interest include ornamental grasses such as: Japanese blood grass, miscanthus, and red switchgrass.
- If you are trying to preserve some outdoor herbs such as parsley, rosemary, and chives you can pot them up to grow indoors on a sunny windowsill for a few months, but eventually, they will loose vigor. Other ways to enjoy your herbs past the growing season would be to dry them, or to preserve them in oil or vinegar. Herbs can also be kept frozen until ready for use later on in the year.
